Kudos to all the residents working diligently to eradicate all those weeds. The Committee plans to conduct a thorough survey of the community during April and May. The focus will be on weed abatement, excessive mold/dirt on stucco, and storage in front yards (trash cans/recycle bins, construction/landscaping materials, discarded items, etc.) Please take the next few weeks to survey your property and residence and address any shortcomings. Should you get a notice of a violation but feel unable to address it at this time, please do not ignore the communication. Let the Architectural Committee know your plan to ensure your home and property are in good order.

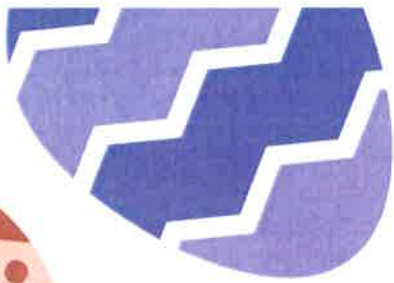
