Annual MEETING & BOARD ELECTIONS

Notice of Potential use of Acclamation Procedure Update Regarding Homeowners Association Election Rules - AB 502 Effective January 1, 2022, Homeowners Associations in California are able to utilize an acclamation procedure specified under a new section of the Civil Code. This allows for Homeowners Associations to save the significant cost of ballot mailings for Board elections if the number of candidates does not exceed the number of board positions to be filled.

This notice is to inform HIgh Country West Homeowners of the High Country West Property Owners Associations' potential use of this procedure if the number of candidates does not exceed the number of board positions to be filled.



WALLYBALL IS AVAILABLE AT HIGH COUNTRY WEST

Architectural Committee: March Outdoor Reminders:

- 1. Remove weeds throughout landscaping.
- 2. Trim landscaping back from sidewalks.
- 3. Clear weeds in and around artificial turf.
- 4. Except for pick-up day your trash cans are always stored out of view.
- 5. Treat the lawn with weed killer (like Weed and Feed).
- 6. Check and repair yard drainage to prevent flooding.
- 7. Remove debris from drainage pipes at the gutter.
- 8. Clear debris, weeds, and moss from sidewalk and gutter cracks.
