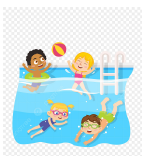

Lifeguard Supervisors Cameron, Alex, Sara, Miles, Gabby, Clare, Minju, Alicia, Anthony, & Marcel.

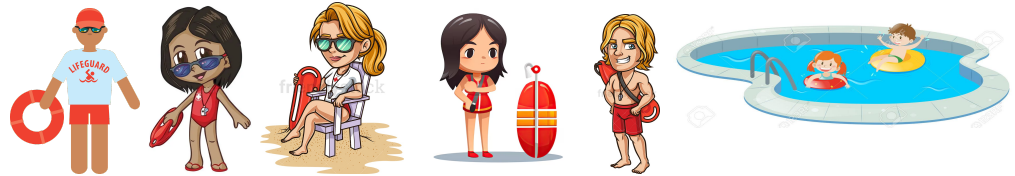
Returning Lifeguards Jordan, Sawyer, Malia, Riley, Becca, Asher, Kenzie, & Caleb.
